LETTER FROM THE CHAIR

Greetings Contributors!

We bring to you our 2025 RADPAC Annual Report. In 2025, RADPAC raised \$722,723 from 1,944 contributors. RADPAC had 59 “Outstanding Practices” participating in a group contribution. Other highlights include RADPAC hosting 18 fundraising events for Members of Congress raising more than \$150,000, attending more than 250 fundraising events for Members of Congress, and coordinating more than 12 visits by Members of Congress to radiology practices. Additionally, RADPAC again was a lead sponsor of the Congressional Women’s Softball Game - a bipartisan fundraising event to raise money for breast cancer patients and families, as well as hosted a joint event at RSNA with GE HealthCare PAC. RADPAC’s visibility and impact on Capitol Hill remains at an all-time high. It is critical that RADPAC maintains this status as radiology continues to face many legislative challenges ahead including, but not limited to, fair reimbursement, cancer screening coverage, scope of practice, larger Medicare reform initiatives, workforce issues and GME residency position funding. I look forward to leading RADPAC in the years to come and welcome your support as we continue to serve as the leading political voice for radiology on Capitol Hill.








